Genesee Idaho Jan 22. 1914

Dear Son Henry,

We have received your letter from Frisco the other day, and to day we have received your card from Los-Angeles. And I expect the next card will be from Mexico, and in a few day more a letter from Australia or S. America, if you keep on agoing like this. Well I surly have to laugh when I read about your experiance on the boat, so you had it wors than I did. But I am sorry that you did not get to see Unkle Vincent. I was thinking of that when I heard that you was in Frisco. Here I sent you the address of a man that used to work for me a year ago last summer. Logan Smith 333-E-4th St. Los Angeles Cal. He is a nice man, and he is prity well acquainted there now I expect, and he might be some assistance to you. The weather has certainly ben fine here since you left here. we had fine sleighing along about xmas and New Year, but the snow has left again, and yesterday and today it has rained , and the creek is up high but not running over. The coldes we had so far, was 15 above ziro. William Baumgartner and R. Hasfurther got married on the 20 of this month. Father Hagy has few removed by the Bishoph to Burk Idaho, and we got the one that was at Burk, last sunday was the first Sunday of the change. The new Priest is a fine strait graceful looking man, over 6 feet tall, black hair, but he speaks poor english , but he speaks fine german .

Bill stayed here for the winter, and may stay over next summer.

As I don't know any more news to interest you, so I'l come to a cose with our best wishes for 1914.
