Dear friend,

Received your letter quite a while ago will answer it tonight to let you know that we are all well yet and hope the same from you's. I suppose it is fine weather out there We had bad weather out here for about three weeks already. It was very nice today but the roads are so muddy we had about one foot snow last Tuesday. But its prity near all gone. It will take quite a while yet before we can start with the work. You have to excuse me for not writing any sooner because I wasn't home for six weeks. Was working at my sister's place. She has a little baby girl. She was a month old the 7<sup>th</sup> of April. I was very glad to hear from you only with that we could see us once. We had a very good time when your Papa and Mamma were at our place. Ester will be there pretty soon again so the dance will start again. I suppose you go to quite a few dances too or not. I was to five dances and two large weddings, between Advent and Lent. My sister Olive and me will have our picture taken on a postal next Sunday so I will send one to you. My sister Louisa the baby of our family will receive her first Communion in June. I will be twenty-one years old the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April. Sister Olive was eighteen in October. One of my brothers is going with the carpeners this summer so there are only four of us at home to do the farming work But Papa and Mamma will be at home too. One of my brother in-law is a carpener so brother Henry is going along with him. The other brother that is home yet his name is Robert he will be sixteen years old in July. There are three of my sisters and one brother merried already. It's getting late already so will close my writing with best regards to all.
