

Early horse-drawn + horse-powered  
combine. The driver of the 20 horses had  
to keep an even motion of machine by  
keeping a certain steady gait of his horses.  
The first combine that I sewed sax on was  
at Helix Oregon (near Pendleton) but it had  
32 horses and my "dog-house" was down  
lower + the other crew stood over my head.  
I got \$3.00 pr. day + had six horses to tend to in  
evening + got 'em curried + harnessed + out to  
the combine in morning by about 6 o'clock  
+ run in eve until about dark.
