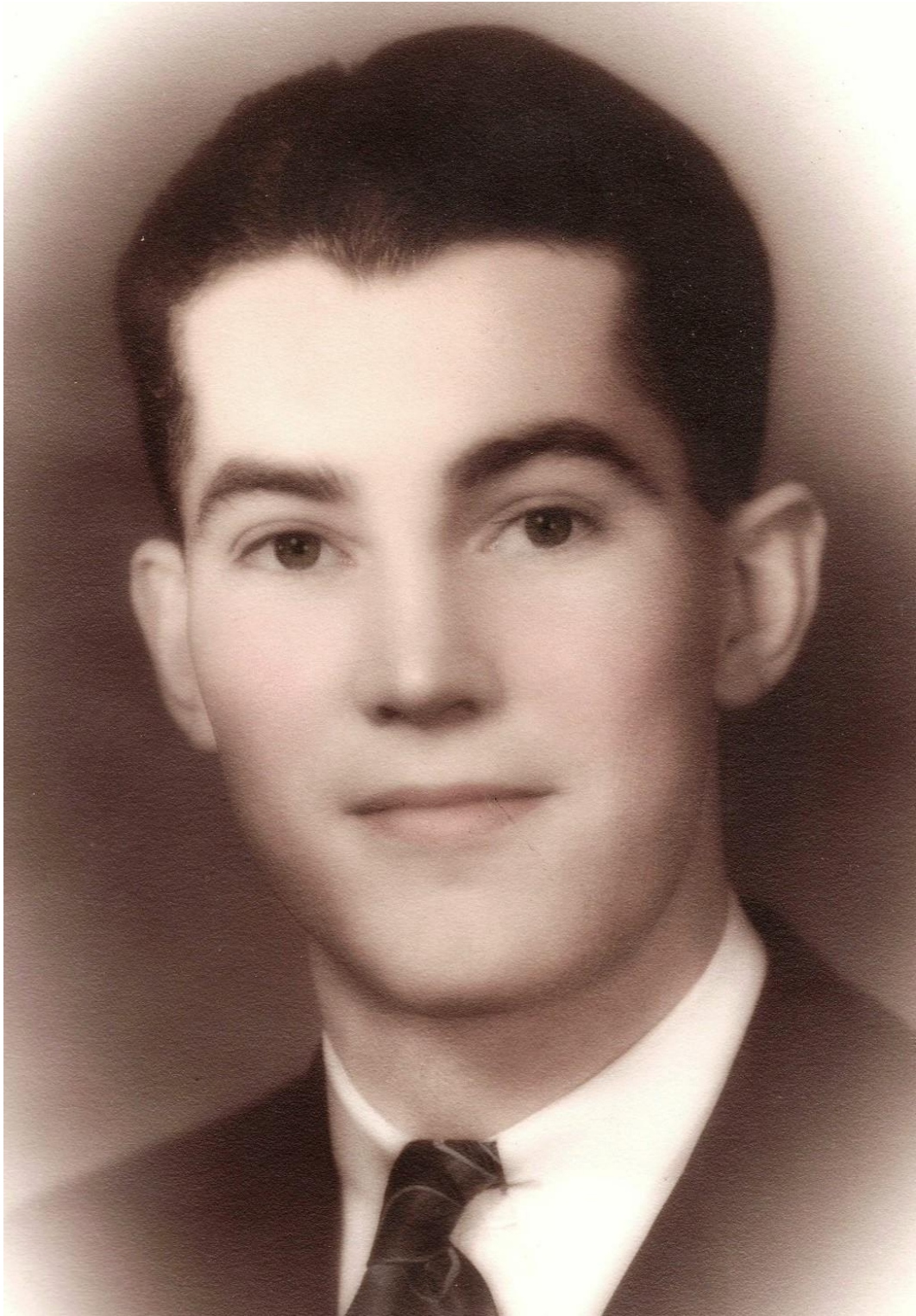
Dear Aunt Alice;
