“Every cow needs a rest period of 6 to 8 weeks if she is to produce the most milk during her next milking period.

A mineral mixture should be kept before pigs at all times.

Poor nutrition and poor management are responsible for fully 50 per cent of the poultry diseases diagnosed by poultry pathologists at the Oklahoma A&M College laboratories.

Hog houses need adequate ventilation at all times.

Farm machinery, to be stored for the winter, should be cleaned and the bright and unprotected metal parts given a coat of special rust preventative grease.

Water is necessary to the welfare of all poultry and livestock. Take steps now to prevent water from freezing this winter, Provide a constant supply at all times.

Provide a dust bath for your layers by partly filling a box with wood ashes and dust. Miz a good lice powder with the dust.

Treat the cows gently. Rough handling and milk production do not go together.

Stir the hens' litter every day or two to keep it dry. A forked stick kept by the hen house door is handy for this purpose.

Soybean oil meal should be supplemented with minerals and essential vitamins to make it a proper supplement for swine.
